Part 1: After Reading Directions for a Fictional Book

Directions: When you are finished reading your fictional book, please answer these questions on the back of your log sheet IN COMPLETE SENTENCES.

- 1) What is the title of your story and who is the author?
- 2) Identify the **settings** and time periods that happen throughout the story.
- 3) List the **main characters** and the **supporting** characters from your story. Make sure you label which character is which type.
- 4) Explain what your story's **plot** is.
- 5) Explain the **introduction** to the problem. How does the author **introduce** you as the reader to the **central problem** of their story?
- 6) What events happen before the **turning point** of the story?
- 7) Explain what the **turning point** is in the story. What happens in your story for the action to considerably change? How do you know? (This is called **rising action**)
- 8) What is the central problem **resolution** in your story? How do you know?
- 9) How is the story "wrapped up"? How does it end? (This is called denouement)
- 10) Explain who is telling the story.
- 11) What type of **genre** is your story and how do you know?
- 12) What is the overall **mood** & **tone** of your story?

Part 2: After Reading Directions for a *Non-Fictional* Book

Directions: When you are finished reading your non-fictional book, please answer the following prompt on the back of your log.

"What is your book about? Write a summary about your book. Your summary should be at least three paragraphs long and include the title and author of your book."

Essay Structure:

First paragraph = introduction and main idea about your book

Middle paragraph(s) = details of your non-fictional text and some things you have learned about

Final paragraph = summary about what you read about and how this has impacted your life as a reader
