

## **Clubs and Other Opportunities 9-12**

Art and Photo	Field trip to art museum locally, nationally or internationally, display & compete in art or photography contests.
Boomerang	Approximately 10 students are selected and trained to do a character education program at Koenig.
FACT	A youth driven movement to spread the truth about tobacco.
<b>FBLA</b> (Future Business Leaders of America)	Learn leadership skills, parliamentary procedure. Study for tests in business and leadership. Compete at local, regional, state and national levels.
<b>FCCLA</b> (Family Career Community Leaders of America)	For Students interested in the career or pleasure of culinary arts. Lean new skills have an opportunity to demonstrate these skills in competitions.
Forensics	Develop speaking skills, practice with a coach, and compete at local, regional and state levels.
Key Club International	Key Club International is the High School version of Kiwanis International a service orientated organization. Key Club provides students service opportunities throughout the community with opportunities in leadership development.
Menagerie	Submit personal writings for publication.
Multicultural Club	Learn about cultures. Sponsor activity nights.
Newspaper Staff	Write articles, take pictures, or set up the monthly newspaper.
Octagon	Meet once a week and do community service projects in Two Rivers.
P.O.P.S. (Power of Positive Students)	Develop skits that present a positive message about drugs, alcohol, tobacco, decision making, relationships, bullying, etc. Present skits to elementary and middle school students.

Robotics	The TRHS Robotics Club combines with other local schools to compete in the FIRST Robotics Competition (FRC). FRC is an international high school robotics competition that requires each team to build an automated robot to compete against others in a different sporting event each year.
School Play (Drama)	Audition for school play/musical.
SOUL (Students of a Universal Light)	A student Christian Club that meets weekly over both lunches.
Spanish Club	Expose members to the culture of Spanish speaking countries through food, field trips and activities.
TATU (Teens Against Tobacco Use)	TATU does anti-tobacco presentations at elementary/middle schools.
Travel Opportunities	Travel to Mexico or other Spanish speaking country. Must be in Foreign Language class 3 or 4 years. Other clubs may sponsor other trips.
Yearbook	Develop the annual yearbook.
