8. ADMINISTRATOR(S) UPDATES

- A. Korinek discussed the efforts of the team in preparing for and completing the ACT and Pre-ACT testing with the 9th-11th grade students from both TRHS and Lighthouse Learning Academy. The third and fourth grade elementary students will be taking the Forward exam Mar 28-Mar 30. L.B. Clarke's Forward Exam will take place Apr 1.
- B. Butler wrapped up winter sports with nearly 100 students participating in the following sports: boys basketball, girls basketball, swimming, and wrestling. There are 85 students signed up for spring sports. It's great to get involved! Wester reported on the 8th grade LTC trip, the 8th grade earned bowling/arcade trip, Forward Exam timetable, the 6th grade Science Barlow Planetarium field trip, and the upcoming Clarke Fun night.
- C. Gallagher complimented Jansky and the many volunteers on the successful Fun Run which included: 10-Mile Run, Kids Race, and 3-Person Relay. Thank you to everyone! Engh shared the Esports Fortnite team ranked 22nd out of 130 teams competing. He applauded Korinek for his leadership and work on the ACT/Pre-ACT. He also commended Garber and her IT team for helping things run smoothly.
- D. Johnson reported that Klein, Korinek, and she will meet with CESA 7 to work on the development of the Strategic Planning process. She shared the roofing and geotechnical engineering bids to keep all commissioners informed of the selection and next steps for these projects.
