Regular School Board Meeting - February 24, 2020

- 1. The meeting was called to order by President Jaimie Salta at 6:30 p.m.

A. Lisa Quistorf offered condolences on behalf of the district to the family of Patrick Gagnon who passed away on February 15, 2020. Pat served on the Two Rivers Public School Board of Education from 1979 – 1994. This is a great loss to our community. Stacy Watzka reported that because of all of the generous donations we have received over the past two months, we have been able to help more than 24 families. The lunch deficit is approximately \$9,000.00 whereas in years past it

was \$14,000 -\$17,000. Stacy is working with families to set up payment plans. Maria Veldre reminded Stacy that the Board will help in any way they can. Stacy also reported that Prairie Farms is working out very well as our new milk supplier. Online ordering is going very smooth. Austin Schroeger provided an update on eSports. There is one week left to this season. Recruiting for next year will start soon. He also reported that the live stream test stream went very well and it is ready to go. Chad Bauknecht reported that next week the reading celebration begins. Bridgett Klein reported that on February 13th special education and general education staff took part in a mock procedural compliance self-assessment. IEP's were pulled and reviewed to make sure they are compliant. Bridgett reported that there was much positive feedback and great discussion. Allies for Mental Health in Education will be meeting on the next steps and action plan. Future Raider Day took place on February 17th. Alex Ourada reported that there is a Middle School wrestling meet going on tonight with more than 120 wrestlers. Alex also reported that he is working on Summer School and that the next Community Meeting is scheduled for March 2nd at 6:15 p.m. Craig Rysticken and Brian Gallagher reported that Team Cody Night was a great community event. They also reported that there is a Forensics competition taking place at TRHS right now and they reminded everyone that on March 3rd juniors will take the ACT test and seniors will be at school for ACP.
