14. District Administrator’s Report:


- A. Austin Schroeger presented an Ever Alert system from American time. Ever Alert is a 22” digital or analog clock with weather alerts, bells, messaging and paging system. Fire and burglar alarms also tie into the system. Instructions for the messaging system can be changed at any time as needed. The safety component of this system is great. The company has offered a \$48,590 discount on this purchase. This will be on the agenda at the next meeting. School Resource Officer, Jason Zipperer reported that next Monday is the Let’s Talk ALICE Training event at Koenig Elementary. He also reported that Jake Glaser is working with students on DARE. Megan Klumpyan is working with students on DARE as well and also attending school for forensic interviews. Jason Zipperer is working with his Intro to Criminal Justice students on report writing and vehicle contacts. Brian Gallagher reported that the Jazz Concert is beginning at 7:00 p.m. tonight and FCCLA, FBLA and Forensics all have students moving on to state competition. Last Thursday was Mental Health day sponsored by Student Government. Jeff Yalden, who is a motivational speaker, spoke to the staff and students. There was also a Pep Rally along with student/staff games. There were four sessions offered with 20 options. Tim Wester reported that two groups of students toured LTC and UWGB. Parent-Teacher conferences took place this week along with Brats for Books with proceeds going to purchase books for classrooms. The Statewide Tornado Drill also took place this week. Muffins with Moms date is set for April 15th. On April 23rd, 6th Grade students will take part in Beach Clean-up on Memorial Drive and Neshotah Beach. Data will be collected. Alex Ourada reported on Forward Testing winding down after a hectic three-week schedule. Third Quarter Activity Night recently took place with a theme of “Glow in the Dark”.
