A. Updates from administrative units:

Lisa Quistorf attended a Legal Seminar in regards to liability of Covid-19 protocols. The insurance carrier stresses following protocol. We could be liable if someone gets ill if protocol is not followed. Mask breaks and outside time without masks are okay. Please

continue to follow the distance guidelines and wash hands regularly. We were able to keep schools open and healthy. President Salta thanked the community for support in the protocols. Mask protocol will remain through summer school. Sheila Bialek was introduced as the new Administrative Assistant. Tim Engh announced our new Athletics Website, tworiversraiders.com. This site will be operational for the 2021-2022 school year and contain schedules, rosters, game links, announcements, game results, etc. with the ability to customize the site.
