### Regular School Board Meeting - May 11, 2020

- 1. The meeting was called to order by President Salta at 6:30 p.m.

## 13. District Administrator's Report:

A. Updates from administrative units
Lisa Quistorf thanked the Police Officers for all they do and in recognition of National
Police Officer Week. School Resource Officers, Jake Glaser, Megan Klumpyan, and Jason
Zipperer provide an important role in our school to home connection. They have helped

deliver student packets and food delivery also during the school closure. On May 13<sup>th</sup> the TRHS Hope Train will travel through town. This is a wonderful event that reinforces the work we are doing and the connections with families. May 21<sup>st</sup> is the last day for TRHS seniors to turn in their work. June first is the last week of school. As you travel through the city you will see banners of our graduates hanging from the light poles in recognition of their accomplishments. Lisa Quistorf also provided an update on what summer school may look like this year with students unable to be in the buildings. She also thanked the Board for their support during the pandemic as we work at balancing families and workloads. Our staff has done a great job at something we've never done before with the school closure caused by the pandemic. Austin Schroeger reported that he is planning for next school year purchases. He has found that there is a supply/demand crisis and production is at a standstill and a shortage in the supply chain. We will need 300 Chromebooks for next school year. Last year there was a state grant that was withdrawn for technology. We always check for grants to help with purchases. Lisa Quistorf shared the TRHS Course Book with the Board. The question was asked about how many of the 111 graduating seniors are going on to secondary school. That information will be shared at a later meeting when that information is available. We are finding that more students are going the technical college route because it is less expensive. Graduation will be on June 7<sup>th</sup>. On Saturday, June 6<sup>th</sup>, the graduates will drive through town to TRHS wearing their caps and gowns. Once at the high school the Class of 2020 will be announced. The ceremony will be put together with speeches, and aired on our District webpage and Facebook on Sunday, June 7<sup>th</sup>. This is a very special and difficult time for our graduates and will be a memorable graduation. We need to celebrate and work together. Coming events were announced.
