- 1. The meeting was called to order by Vice President, Maria Veldre at 6:30 p.m.

- 5. Motion by Com. Williams, seconded by Com. Schroeder to approve the agenda as posted; motion carried unanimously.
- 6. Motion by Com. Williams, seconded by Com. Ross, to approve the minutes from the Regular School Board Meeting of May 13, 2019; motion carried unanimously.

 - A. Updates from administrative units
 - Bridgett Klein provided an update on PBIS (Positive Behavior Intervention Systems). She also reported that graduate letters for the post school survey will be going out soon. We can receive \$1,500 for each survey taken. Allies for Mental Health will also be meeting June 24-26. Dana McLinn reported that on May 20th Beth Wilson, Jenny Price and Dana accepted the WI School of Recognition Award in Madison for Koenig Elementary School. This is the 14th award received by Koenig.
